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CDFI Credit Union Impact

Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFIs) must meet stringent criteria to become certified. CDFI credit unions must:


- Direct at least 60% of their lending toward economically distressed people and communities, and
- Build members' capacity to manage credit, increase savings, and increase their financial well-being.

Montana's 4 CDFI Credit Unions:

- Have combined assets of \$1.3 billion
- Serve 76,916 members through 17 branch locations

Montana's CDFI Credit Unions achieve impact through \$950.2 million in active loans to members, including:

- \$418.1 million in community mortgage lending
- \$249.5 million in local consumer financing
- \$193.5 million in lending to local businesses
- \$89.1 million in affordable small-dollar lending



In Montana's CDFI Investment Areas:

- 19.0% of residents have incomes below the federal poverty line
- The median family has an annual income of \$56,771
